This Thursday evening (April 14) is the date for the annual Take Back the Night walk to raise awareness of the very serious issue of domestic violence. Like all communities, East Greenbush has suffered dearly from the tragedy of domestic violence. The annual walk is organized by the Family and Friends of Liza Ellen Warner and supported by the family and friends of Nikki Hart. The loss of these two young women is incalculable to their loved ones and profoundly diminishes the life of the whole community. The Take Back the Night event will begin at 6:30 p.m. in Onderdonk Park and will be followed by a walk around Hampton Manor Lake at 7:00 p.m. One antidote to the solitary darkness of domestic violence is the solidarity of an entire community determined to come together to bring the issue out into the light. Please come and join us if you can. Few issues are as important as this one.
