

**TOWN OF EAST GREENBUSH
RESOLUTION 16-2007**

Resolution to increase the Income Levels for the Partially Tax Exemption of Aged Persons (Section 467 of the Real property Tax Law) AND the Partial Tax Exemption of Persons with Disabilities and Limited Incomes (Section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law).

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of East Greenbush, has set a policy to ensure that every property owner in the Town of East Greenbush that is entitled to a Real Property Tax Exemption, receives one; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 187 of the laws of 2006 now allows municipalities to increase the maximum income level for the Partial Tax Exemption of Aged Persons, under Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law, and Chapter 187 of the laws of 2006, allows for the increase in the maximum income level for Persons with Disabilities and Limited Incomes, under Section 459-C; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of East Greenbush is sympathetic to the needs of our Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of East Greenbush does hereby adopt the revised maximum income levels on the Assessment Rolls prepared in 2007 as follows:

\$27,001 to \$27,900	30 %	\$29,001 to \$29,900
\$27,901 to \$28,800	25 %	\$29,901 to \$30,800
\$28,801 to \$29,700	20 %	\$30,801 to \$31,700
\$29,701 to \$30,600	15 %	\$31,701 to \$32,600
\$30,601 to \$31,500	10 %	\$32,601 to \$33,500
\$31,501 to \$32,400	5 %	\$33,501 to \$34,400
\$32,400 and over	-0-	\$34,400 and over
