Communications/Announcements/Reports

Linda Kennedy, Town Clerk stated the Clerk's office has received reports from the following departments and will be on file for review: Town Clerk, Receiver of Taxes, Building, Youth, Supervisor/Comptroller, Police, Highway and Water.

Councilperson Matters, reminded the board that payroll need civil service certification by January 31. It is important to restate the importance of Internal controls. And note that the Water/Sewer rates are not on this month's agenda, she feels that more work looking into how to increase rates. And happy to see the resolution was put on the agenda for a public hearing on the Town code of ethics.

Councilperson Malone, stated that the Town has received a letter from DEC stating the town has met all of the requirements of the Consent Order R4-2000-213 and the schedule of compliance has been satisfied. As a result, the sewer connection moratorium is lifted.

Phil also stated that back when the town was deciding to either with the County sewer or upgrade our own, we chose to upgrade what we already had and at this point it has saved the town hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Councilperson Mangold stated that Liberty Tax services have moved to Columbia Plaza. And beep and wave to the guy in the street.

Councilperson DiMartino thanked all who participated in the Holiday events for the Youth & Community Services department, tree lighting, decorate the town tree and chili contest.

Open Public Privilege: NOTE: Each speaker shall state name and address prior to addressing the Board and shall be granted the floor for up to five minutes. The Board thanks everyone in attendance for their understanding and also for their desire to actively participate in the decision making process locally.

Open portion started at 7:05.

- 1) Chris DeFruscio commented on the issue of inter-fund borrowing was done a long time ago and now it looks like we are going to step back into this again between the water and sewer funds.
- 2) Hal Betters thanked Keith and the team he worked with on the WWTP project. B) reference to the public hearings on the agenda, he feels that they are scheduled too early.
c) stated that the water/ sewer funds should not be losing money if the County raised our rates, or other bill comes forward, the rates should be raised accordingly at the time it happens so we don't get way behind in debt.

3) Margaret Miller showed the board a water filter from her house in Hampton Manor and doesn't feel the manor rates should go up until the quality of their water is fixed.

4) Pete Stenson regarding sewer rates went to CFAC about inter-fund borrowing and doesn't want rates to change until this committee comes up with a solution. B) At the organizational meeting there were people hired for the Zoning board he feels that seven members are too many it should only be five. C) He also stated that the pre-board meeting should move to 7:00pm so more people can attend, and would like to see the topics that are going to be discussed along with any presentations that will be held prior to the meeting.

5) Jack Conway thanked the Millers for bringing in the water filter to show the Manor water is undrinkable. B) congratulations of the report from DEC regarding WWTP. He stated that Mary Beth Bianconi had a great presentation at the pre-board and understands why the town needs to do something regarding the need for revenue to pay back bond.

c) He also wanted the board to vote no on the PDD on Thompson Hill

d) Wanted to know if the lots were drawn yet for terms on the Ethics Board

6) Ed Gilbert stated he was against the town paying the Save East Greenbush or even donating to them for legal services they concurred from their against casino fight. Commented that Councilperson Matters recused herself from the Ethic Board as long as Ed was a member however she is bringing forward a resolution tonight to let the citizens file complaints against any town employee. Supervisor Langley suggested that they call the proposed resolution for a public hearing to be a workshop so they can move forward on ethics issues.

7) Eileen Grant congratulated board for the WWTP and that we should use Mary Beth Bianconi to join in on the decision making process on rates. Commented on the resolution regarding timely submission of resolutions to the board. She wants them on the website sooner than they are now so residents know what are going to be the topics.

8) Bonnie Kenna stated she attended the October Meeting regarding no casino, board of ethics if you go to the Attorney Generals website may questions can be answered and is unsure why the resolution was tabled in Oct.

9) Dave Van Wormer commented on the DPW he stated that the lady who stood up and had the dirty water filter he said that three years ago the Town sent out survey letters to the residents of Hampton Manor to connect to the Town Water and they all sent back survey that they did not want to it was too costly. He asked what was going on in the DPW taking wings off plows, using more sand then calcium on the roads. He commented on a facebook posting from Debbie DiMartino. Dave feels that problems started with the men being laid off and now they are shorthanded.

10) Liz Tice stated she never heard of plowing with no wings just so the snow doesn't go in peoples driveways.

11) Tom Grant feels that the DPW should have a work force analysis done. He stated that Sue, Phil and Mary Ann did a good job regarding WWTP. He stated he doesn't feel that a public hearing should be held the same night as the meeting they are voting on the issue.

12) Quinton Curtis stated that he feels that the board should allow the residents to complain unless they have something to worry about. And that no wings on plows is unheard of.

13) Bonnie Lester wants more people from Hampton Manor to attend board meetings. She also stated that have meetings later and forgo dinner once in a while.

14) Martin Seims commented on Jack Conway's suggestion to donate or contribute to Save East Greenbush to help finance their debt. It is unconstitutional to spend town funds for such a thing.

A Resolution authorizing the expenditure of Trial expenses for the joint trial of Corellis Holding Corp. vs. Town of East Greenbush, et al. (Index #243997), TDT Realty Corp. vs. Town of East Greenbush, et al. (Index #243999) and Donald R. Corellis vs. Town of East Greenbush, et al. (Index #243996) currently scheduled to commence on March 25, 2015 in the Rensselaer County Supreme Court for the tax assessment year of 2013.

WHEREAS, the Town Board, by Resolution 91-2014, did authorize the appraisals of the three (3) properties which are the subject of the three (3) cases recited above, and

WHEREAS, the Petitioners and Town have filed their respective appraisals with the Court and a joint trial has been scheduled for March 25, 2015 (Honorable Andrew G. Ceresia, J.S.C.) in the Rensselaer County Supreme Court, and

WHEREAS, the anticipated expenses will be the Town's appraiser, Stephen R. Clark of Empire State Appraisal Consultants, Inc. (\$175.00 per hour), the printing of the trial transcript (customarily directed by the Court [\$5.00-\$6.00 per page] and split between the parties), and subpoena and service of subpoena costs (approximately \$150.00 each [likely three to four will be needed]), and

WHEREAS, the Town's Certiorari Counsel continues to work to settle these cases and avoid litigation costs, but nonetheless the Town must be prepared to move forward should the cases proceed to trial, and

WHEREAS, the Town's Comptroller has been advised by Joseph Liccardi, Esq. and the Special Counsel to the Town of East Greenbush for purposes of Tax Certiorari and Litigation issues that the provisions of this Board action are the most cost effective for the Town's finances, now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Town Board hereby finds and determines that the Amendments would: (a) be legally consistent with the provisions of New York General Municipal Law § 808 pursuant to informal opinion no. 91-68 of the New York State Attorney General, (b) further the proper administration of Town government, and (c) be in the best interests of the Town's residents; and

WHEREAS, the scheduling of a Public Hearing is deemed to be just and proper at this time in order for the public to review and comment on a proposed Local Law that would provide for the Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Town Comptroller has heretofore confirmed that none of the provisions of this resolution shall pose an adverse impact to the Town's finances; now, therefore, be it

10-2015 Acknowledgment and Support of the Petition of Roberta Reno to the Army Review Boards Agency to Correct the Military Record of Private Samuel Helms of the Former Greenbush Cantonment

WHEREAS, Roberta Reno, a long-time resident of, and an historian on, the Town of East Greenbush, had, during the course of her research on the U.S. Army's former Greenbush cantonment located in the town's hamlet of Hampton Manor, discovered disturbing circumstances in the service record of Samuel Helms, a young U.S. Army Private in the 1st Regiment of the New York Militia who was stationed at the cantonment during the War of 1812; and

WHEREAS, Pvt. Helms, who had temporarily vacated his post during October of 1812 in order to check on his young family located several Towns distant, but who had returned thereafter, was, nonetheless, subsequently convicted of the charge of desertion and executed at the Cantonment on July 21, 1813; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Reno, through her tireless efforts in uncovering facts and information, has made a case that the conviction and execution of Pvt. Helms were unjust and has submitted a petition to the Army Review Boards Agency (referred to hereinafter as "ARBA") to expunge such conviction from Pvt. Helms' military record; and

WHEREAS, the East Greenbush Town Board acknowledges and supports the meritorious case made by Ms. Reno on behalf of Pvt. Helms and his descendants and wishes to convey such acknowledgement and support to the ARBA in order to augment its consideration of such case; and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller has heretofore confirmed that none of the provisions of this Resolution shall pose any impact on the Town's finances; now, therefore, be it
